The Fruit of the Renewal of Classical Education

- The Association of Classical Christian Schools (ACCS) started in 1994 contains 300 member schools.
- Among Catholics, there has been a resurgence of Catholic classical schools.
- Charter schools are friendly to the classical tradition of education (200 around the country with new ones starting every year).
- There are several thousand classical homeschool co-ops (over 3,000 co-ops), many of which are quite large.
- Colleges have become a part of the renewal of classical liberal arts education around the country (The Master's University, Grove City College, New Saint Andrews...).
- Survey by the ACCS, the Good Soil Report:
 - Classical students excelled in categories that mattered:
 - Higher SAT scores
 - Most likely to trust the Bible as well as to respect science
 - Most likely to care for the environment
 - Most likely to have LGBT friends, while being the least likely to support the LGBT lifestyle
 - Classically educated students from the ACCS retained their faith and commitment to the church at a rate of 80%.
 - There was not a single recorded divorce among all of the surveyed graduates of Classical Christian schools.
