Lesson 5: Fabric/Drapery in Still Life

## **Outline:**

Fabric and Drapery

- Drapery operates independently from other solids. Drapery is more fluid than other structures.
- Properties/principles of fabric drawing:
  - o Gravity pulls fabric down.
  - o A pull keeps fabric up.
  - All vertical lines return to the pulls.
  - o In between two pulls we have a dip.
  - o It takes the shape of the object it drapes over.
  - Often you have extra fabric called "inert fabric", which just sort of pools.
- Vocabulary words and things to watch out for:
  - o A pipe: is a single cone of fabric
  - o A lock: is a zigzagging form
- Toned paper gives a mid-tone. White charcoal gives the opportunity to boost lightest values.
  - o Plan out a three value chart.
- A still life is intentionally planned.
- This prepares students for what it means to create a painting.
