- Review and repeat in order to make learning permanent.

- Review noun declension endings (inflections tell us what the noun jobs are cases).
 - Nouns have case (noun job), number (singular/plural), and gender (masculine/feminine/neuter).
- Review 1st declension endings (feminine).
 - Endings are attached to stems.
 - Write in the stems with their endings.
 - Describe the cases of nouns as a brief review.
- Review 2nd declension endings (masculine and neuter).
 - Chant the endings (come up with your own song/chant).
 - Note the similarities and differences between masculine and neuter endings.
 - Nominative and accusative are always the same in the neuter form.
 - Look at a declension of a 2^{nd} declension noun (ludus, masculine form).
- Translate a few sentences.
 - Label the parts of the sentence.
 - Parse the noun and adjective.
 - Parse the verb.
