Quiz Score Bar Charts

- Tracking class average – Dip at A: Grade replacement quiz time?
 - Always track the class average.
 - When you see a class average, and look for the students who are not performing well on quizzes.
 - Have a student conference with the parents present.
 - Sometimes have a replacement grade quiz. Announce that next week's quiz is a replacement quiz.
 - Warn students that a grade replacement quiz will not happen very often, they should not depend on this.
 - There is no wiggle room for the replacement grade targets.

Grade redemption

- Taking over a failing class
 - Talk with the class about how you need to redeem this situation.
 - Your averages will be the improved by how you improve incrementally.
 - Everyone is going to get on track.
- On-ramping new students
 - Tell students that they need to learn what happened in the fall.
 - Communicate with the students about mastery as soon as possible.
 - Help students get up to speed as soon as possible.
 - Establish tutoring after school.
 - They probably will not do well on the first quiz. Each week if you make a new high grade it will become your new average.
