    - These are all accessible to students before middle school.
  - Eric Whitacre, *Lux Arumque*, this is a good piece to begin a study of light.

  - Joseph Seiss: Fairest Lord Jesus
  - o St. Francis of Asissi: All Creatures of Our God and King
  - o Maltbie Babcock: This is My Father's World
  - Make a practice of singing these hymns with the students in grammar school.
- The Painters
  - o Johannes Vermeer: The Astronomer
  - o Jan Matejko: Astronomer Copernicus
  - Vincent van Gogh: Starry Night
  - Joseph Wright: An Experiment on a Bird in an Air Pump, The Alchemist Discovering Phosphorous, The Alchemist in Search of the Philosopher's Stone
- The Writers Literary Classics
  - o Annie Dillard: Pilgrim at Tinker Creek
