##### Well-Ordered Language Model Lesson

- The pictures goes along with the analogy in the chapter. In this case, adverbs are subordinate elements like the table legs are to the table top.
- Analogies are helpful to take from the known to the unknown.
- Four major components to each lesson:
  - **Review**
    - This is done in a question and answer format.
    - Enjoy the review, this should be jovial and energizing.
    - This should be two to three minutes of quick review.
  - **Practice It**
    - This is at the end in the teacher's notes.
    - This is a fast moving activity.
    - Make these fit to your class.
    - Use sentences from your books to reinforce the grammar and bring it back into context.
    - Practice the grammatical concepts with the fables and stories and poems (even using these on the day before, during the lesson, or later in the day).
  - **Learn It**
    - Learn it is in their student books.
    - Possibly make this into an oral exercise or use paper and pencil.
  - **Analyze It**
    - There are always two sentences to put up on the board where you are teaching the students the script.
    - The sentence analysis script is written out for you. This script is like a template.
    - Analyze the following sentence, "Fritz laughs uncontrollably."
